
Black PR Wire Launches Black History Month Campaign

BPRW to Host Black History Month Webinar in Partnership with Business Wire

Are you familiar with the media history makers and shakers? Here's your chance to meet some of them up close and personal. Business Wire and Black PR Wire will host/present our annual Black History Month Webinar as a part of this year's Minority Leadership Series. The webinar will be held in recognition of Black History Month and is entitled "The State of the Black Media."

February is National Women Inventors Month

Did you know that the windshield wipers, coffee filters, and liquid paper were invented by a woman? Women have played a vital role in the world of innovation. During National Woman Inventors Month, BPRW pays tribute to five black women inventors and the extraordinary things that might never have existed without them.

- 1. Alice H. Parker** – Alice paved the way for the central heating systems that most of us enjoy today. She patented the *System of central heating using natural gas*.
- 2. Valerie Thomas** – If you enjoy 3D movies and television, you have Valerie to thank. Valerie, a physicist, inventor, and NASA data analyst, invented the illusion transmitter, the first mechanism that

- allowed images to be viewed in 3D using concave mirrors and rays of light.
- 3. Dr. Shirley Jackson** – Dr. Jackson, a Theoretical Physicist, conducted breakthrough basic scientific research that enabled others to invent the portable fax, the touch-tone telephone, solar cells, fiber optic cables, and the technology behind caller ID and call waiting. Thanks to her

discovery, we can screen known, unknown, or unwanted phone calls and receive the notification of new incoming calls while on another call.

A big hooray to all persistent, passionate, and FEARLESS women inventors whose inventions have changed our lives every day for the better.

POWER PROFILER: SIDNEY POITIER


Hollywood icon **Sidney Poitier** was the first African American to win an Academy Award for *Best Actor*, receiving the honor in 1964 for his performance in *"Lilies of the Field."* A native of Nassau, Bahamas, Sidney Poitier also directed several films, including *"Buck and the Preacher"* and *"Stir Crazy."*

Poitier made his Hollywood debut in the 1950 feature film *"No Way Out,"* and he followed in 1951 with *"Cry, the Beloved Country,"* a drama set in South Africa during the time of apartheid. He enjoyed a career breakthrough in 1955 with the popular *"Blackboard Jungle,"* portraying a troubled but gifted student at an inner-city school.

Poitier's success as an actor reached new heights when he scored an Academy Award

nomination for the 1958 crime drama *"The Defiant Ones,"* with Tony Curtis. The following year, he lit up the screen as a leading man in the musical *"Porgy and Bess,"* co-starring with **Dorothy Dandridge**. Both this film and his impressive turn in the 1961 film adaptation of *"A Raisin in the Sun"* helped make the actor a top star.

In 1967, Poitier delivered three very different yet equally strong performances. He played Philadelphia detective **Virgil Tibbs** in the Southern crime drama *"In the Heat of the Night."* In *"Guess Who's Coming to Dinner"* he played a Black man engaged to a white



woman in this ground-breaking look at interracial marriage.

Poitier received numerous honors during his legendary career. He was appointed a *Knight Commander* of the British Empire in 1974, which entitled him to use the title *"sir,"* though he chose not to do so. In 2009, he received the *Presidential Medal of Freedom* from **President Barack Obama**. Two years later, he was feted by the **Film Society of Lincoln Center**, earning the organization's *Chaplin Lifetime Achievement Award*. Poitier also served as non-resident Bahamian ambassador to Japan and to the **United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization**.
